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Sweet Potato Pie

3 sweet potatoes1/2 tsp. nutmeg1/2 c. butter, softened4 eggs, beaten1 T. vanilla extract3/4 c. evaporated milk2 1/2 c. white sugar2 (9 in.) pie crust, unbaked



1. Bring a large pot of water to a boil. Add sweet potatoes and cook until tender but still firm, about 30 minutes. Drain, cool, peel and mash. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

2. In a large bowl, combine sweet potatoes, butter, sugar, vanilla and nutmeg. In a small bowl, whisk together the eggs and milk and blend into the sweet potato mixture.

3. Pour into pie shells and bake in preheated oven for 60 minutes, or until done.




Glittered Pumpkins from Martha Stewart Living, October 2006

These decorations bring sparkle to tables and serving areas-and they last far longer than jack-o'-lanterns. To make one, use a medium-size paintbrush to spread a layer of white glue over the surface of a small pumpkin. Hold pumpkin over a paper plate or a sheet of newspaper to catch excess glitter. Sprinkle powder glitter over pumpkin in several colors (we used penny, persimmon, orange, and pink champagne), covering completely. Let dry for about one hour; shake off excess glitter. Coat stem with brown acrylic paint; let dry. Pumpkins will keep for months.
